## VOLUNTEER

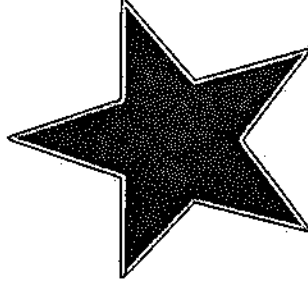

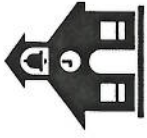

- ◆ Read every night to a family member for at least 30 minutes to improve my reading fluency skills and talk or write about what I have read to help with my understanding using the strategies my parents learned at parent workshops.
- ◆ Use online resources provided by the school to practice fluency, problem solving, and comprehension skills.
- ◆ Practice strategies and activities learned during family fun nights such as Literacy Night and the Math Carnival to improve my literacy and math fluency, problem solving skills and reading comprehension.



## As families, we will...

# ... TO ENSURE SUCCESS

## Our School Goals:

We will provide all students with high quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment to meet high academic standards.

In grades K, 1, & 2, 100% of the students will achieve one year of reading growth as measured by the F & P Assessment.

100% of students in K-2 will meet or exceed the standard for writing and 50% will exceed on the GCPS writing rubric for all genres.

90% of K-2 students will demonstrate expected or high growth on the GCPS DA Posttest in the area of Math.

Students in grades 3, 4, & 5 will increase their Georgia Milestones Mathematics and Reading score by 7-10% from the previous school year.

The specific academic skills that Partee Elementary will be focusing on this year are :

**Math** — Math fluency and problem solving  
**Reading** — Reading with fluency and comprehension

## Goals of Gwinnett County Public Schools:

**Language Arts:** All students will graduate as analytical readers, writers, and communicators of language.

**Math:** Students are expected to demonstrate proficiency through a deep understanding of numeracy with the ability to compute with fluency, think critically, and communicate their mathematical reasoning effectively.

**Science:** Students will develop a strong content understanding in the earth, life, and physical sciences as well as develop problem-solving and critical-thinking skills.

**Social Studies:** Students will develop a strong understanding of themselves and their role and responsibility in society by discovering the heritage of their nation within a global context.
